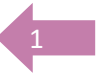


XY Scarf

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The XY Scarf is an androgynous triangular design that fits both women and men. With the Skies yarn from Scheepjes, the scarf becomes wonderfully soft and comfortable to wear around the neck. If you want to make XY as a shawl to wear over your shoulders, just repeat the pattern until you reach the size you want.

Materials:

- Scheepjes Skies Light (100% Premium Blend Cotton; 100 g/340 m).
Color 116 x 1 skein
Color 117 x 1 skein
- Hook 4.0 mm
- Tapestry needle

Size:

If you use the same yarn and hook as the pattern indicates, the scarf will measure approximately 150 x 110 x 110 cm.

You can easily adjust the size of this scarf by removing or adding rows, which is described later in the pattern.

Abbreviations, US terms:

Ss – slip stitch

Ch - chain

Sc – single crochet

Blo – back loop only; insert hook under back loop only.

Tips:

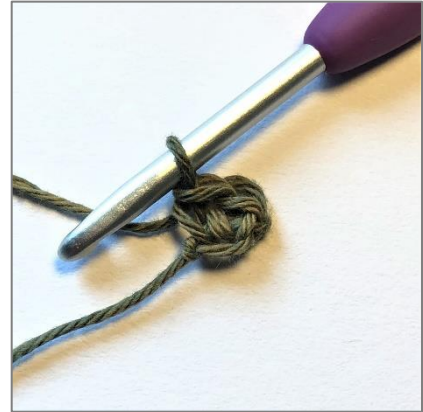
- Ch1 in the beginning of a row does not count as a stitch.
- Turn your work after each row.
- Stitches between () are repeated as many times as indicated after the parenthesis.
- Stitches between | | shows how many stitches you should have after completing the row.

Pattern:

Row 1:

Ch2, 2sc in the 2nd ch from your hook. Turn.

|2 sc|



Row 2:

Ch1 (does not count as a stitch here and throughout),
1sc in the same sc.
2sc in next sc. Turn.

|3 sc|



Row 3:

Ch1, 2sc in the same sc.
1sc **blo** in next sc, 1sc in next sc. Turn.

|4 sc|



Row 4:

Ch1, 1sc in the same sc.
1sc **blo** in next 2 sc, 2sc in next sc. Turn.

|5 sc|

Place a marker in the last sc made to mark that this is the side where you will make all the increases.

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Row 5:

Ch1, 2sc in the same sc.
(1sc **blo** in next sc) until the second last sc on the row.
1sc in next sc. Turn.

|6 sc|



Row 6:

Ch1, 1sc in the same sc.
(1sc **blo** in next sc) until the second last sc on the row.
2sc in next sc. Turn.

|7 sc|



Repeat row 5 – 6 until the scarf has the size you like. The shawl on page 1 has 178 rows in total. Then you crochet the finishing row.

Stitch count following rows:

Each row increases with 1 sc.



Finishing row:

Ch1, 1ss in the same sc.
(1ss **blo** in next sc) until the second last sc on the row.
1ss in next sc. Cut yarn and fasten ends.
