

Singing Sea Blanket

Materials:

Yarn:

Scheepjes Merino Soft (50% Superwash Merino, 25% Microfiber, 25% Acrylic;
50 g/105 m)

3 x color 610, Turner.

3 x color 612, Vermeer.

3 x color 613, Giotto.

If you like to make a blanket with two colors, you will need 4 skein of each color.

Hook: 4.5 mm

2 markers

Tapestry needle

Scissors

Shape and size:

The Singing Sea Blanket is a rectangular blanket that is worked in rows.

If you use the same yarn, hook and gauge provided in this pattern the measurements will be approx. 65 x 95 cm after blocking.

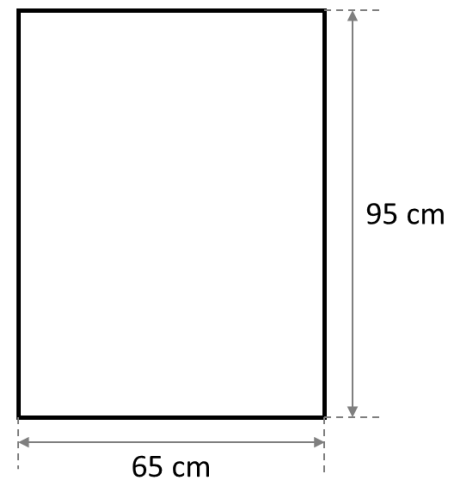
Gauge:

9 rows with 17 dc's = 10 x 10 cm.

Customize the size:

It's easy to customize the size of this blanket.

The width is adjusted by increasing or decreasing the number of chains when you start the blanket (see row 1). The length of the blanket is adjusted by adding or removing repetitions of rows 7–10.



Color distribution:

The color is indicated in brackets at each row.

Color A – 612

Color B – 610

Color C – 613

At the end of the pattern there is also a table of the color distribution.

Abbreviations, UK terms:

St - stitch

Ch(s) – chain(s)

Ss – slip stitch

Dc – double crochet

Tr – treble crochet

Tips:

- This pattern is crocheted in rows.
 - Turn after each row.
 - Ch1 in the beginning of a row does **not** count as a stitch.
 - Ch3 in the beginning of a row counts as 1 tr.
 - Stitches between [] are repeated as many times as indicated after the square brackets.
 - Stitches between | | shows how many stitches you should have after completing the row.
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Pattern:

Start: (color A)

Ch110.

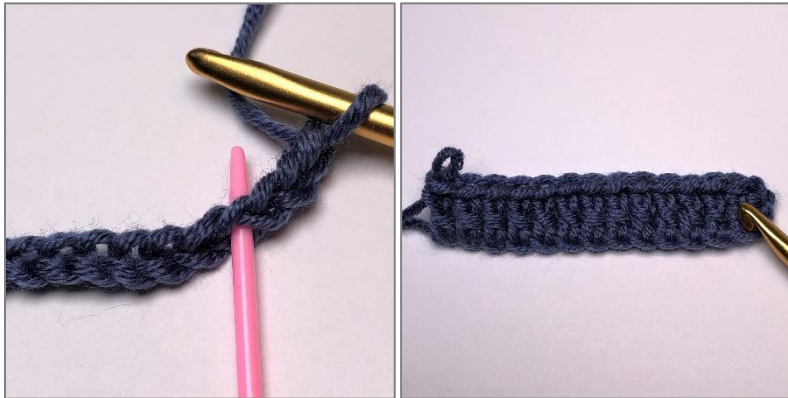
If you want a larger or smaller blanket, crochet the desired **even** number of stitches.

Row 1: (color A)

1tr in the 4th ch from the hook (skipped chs counts as 1 tr),

[1tr in next ch] until last ch, turn.

|108 tr|



Row 2: (color A)

Ch1 (does not count as a st here and throughout),

1dc into st at base of ch, [1dc in next tr] until last tr,

ch3, remove the hook and place a marker in the loop, turn.

|108 dc|



Row 3: (color B)

Tip: Place a marker in the third ch to make it easier to find when crocheting the next row.

Insert your hook in the first dc, pick up color B and pull through,

ch3 (counts as 1 tr here and throughout),

[skip 1 dc, 1tr in next dc, 1tr in the dc you just skipped (= 1 crossed trebles)] until second last dc, 1tr in next dc, turn.

|2 tr, 53 crossed trebles|



Row 4 (as row 2): (color B)

Ch1, 1dc into st at base of ch, [1dc in next tr] until last tr,

ch3, remove the hook and place a marker in the loop, turn.

|108 dc|



Row 5: (color A)

Tip: Place a marker in the third ch to make it easier to find when crocheting the next row.

Insert your hook in the first dc, pick up previous color and pull through,

ch3, [1tr in next dc] until the last dc, turn.

|108 tr|



Row 6 (as row 2): (color A)

Row 7: (color B)

Tip: Place a marker in the third ch to make it easier to find when crocheting the next row.

Insert your hook in the first dc, pick up previous color and pull through,

ch3, [skip 1 dc, 1tr in next dc, 1tr in the dc you just skipped (= 1 crossed trebles)] until second last dc, 1tr in next dc, turn.

|2 tr, 53 crossed trebles|

Row 8 (as row 2): (color B)

Row 9 (as row 5): (color A)

Row 10 (as row 2): (color A)

Row 11–106:

Repeat rows 7–10 another 25 times.

If you want to crochet a larger blanket, repeat rows 7–10 as many times as desired. Note that you will need more yarn than the pattern indicates if more repetitions are done.

- If you are making a blanket with three colors, follow the chart on next page.
- I recommend blocking the blanket to enhance the stitches and pattern. A brief description of how to block is available on my [blog](#).
